CAROLYN CREWE GRAY was a board member of the **Rappahannock Concert Association.** Her estate bequeathed funding for music education to the Rappahannock
Concert Association. We organized focus groups to determine the best use of our resources,
and found there was no strings instruction in Northern Neck schools. We decided to name our
project "The Strings Crewe" after her maiden name. Once students have had at least one
