## "STRINGS CREWE" BENEFACTOR



CAROLYN CREWE GRAY was a board member of the Rappahannock Concert Association. Her estate bequeathed funding for music education to the Rappahannock Concert Association. We organized focus groups to determine the best use of our resources, and found there was no strings instruction in Northern Neck schools. We decided to name our project "The Strings Crewe" after her maiden name. Once students have had at least one year of weekly lessons, they may join The String Orchestra for Northern Neck Youth. Additional supporting organizations: River Counties Community Foundation; Virginia Commission for the Arts/NEA; Cole Charitable Trust; Northern Neck Orchestra; Rappahannock Music Study Club; and the Unitarian Servetus Endowment Fund.

He played a side-by-side performance with the Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra where he played co-principal trumpet. He is a Music Director at Nomini Baptist Church in Montross.

**Arline Hinkson, Crewe Advisor and Piano Accompanist**. She did her piano studies with Katherine Bacon at the Julliard School of Music and with Pierre Sancan at the Conservatoire de Paris. She received a Master's Degree in Music Education from Long Island University. She performs for the Northern Neck Orchestra and churches on the Northern Neck.
